

SETTING "SAFETY LOCK"

The safety lock prevents unsupervised operation by little children.

To set, press and hold RESET pad for 3 seconds, LOCK indicator lights.

To cancel, press and hold RESET pad for 3 seconds, LOCK indicator goes off

Electrical Requirements

The electrical requirements are a 120 volt 60 Hz, AC only, 20 amp. It is recommended that a separate circuit serving only the oven be provided. The oven is equipped with a 3-prong grounding plug. It must be plugged into a wall receptacle that is properly installed and grounded.

Extension Cord

If it is necessary to use an extension cord, use only a 3-wire extension cord that has a 3 blade-grounding plug and a 3-slot receptacle that will accept the plug on the microwave oven. The marked rating of the extension cord shall be equal to or greater than the electrical rating of the appliance.

- Notes: 1. If you have any questions about the grounding or electrical instructions, consult a qualified electrician or service person.
- Neither Mackarl nor the dealer can accept any liability for damage to the oven or personal injury resulting from failure to observe the electrical connection procedures.

Radio or TV Interference

Should there be any interference caused by the microwave oven to your radio or TV, check that the microwave oven is on a different circuit, relocate the radio or TV as far away from the oven as feasible or check position and signal of receiving antenna.

UTENSILS GUIDE

This section lists which utensils can be used in the microwave, which ones have limited use for short periods, and which ones should not be used in the microwave.

Recommended

- Microwave browning dish Use to brown the exterior of small items such as steaks chops, or pancakes. Follow the directions provided with your browning dish.
- Microwaveable plastic wrap Use to retain steam. Leave a small opening for some steam to escape and avoid placing it directly on the food.
- Paper towels and napkins Use for short-term heating and covering; these absorb excess moisture and prevent spattering. Do not use recycled paper towels, which may contain metal and could ignite.

SAVE THESE INSTRUCTIONS

- Glass and glass-ceramic bowls and dishes Use for heating or cooking
- Paper plates and cups Use for short-term heating at low temperatures. Do not use recycled paper, which may contain metal and could ignite
- Wax paper Use as a cover to prevent spattering.
- Thermometers --- Use only those labeled "Microwave Safe" and follow all directions.

Limited Use

- Aluminum foil Use narrow strips of foil to prevent overcooking of exposed areas You should keep distance of 1 inch (2.54cm) between aluminum foil and cavity.
- Ceramic, porcelain, and stoneware Use these if they are labeled "Vicrowave Safe" If they are not labeled, test them to make sure they can be used safely
- Plastic Use only if labeled "Microwave Safe". Other plastics can melt
- Straw, wicker, and wood Use only for short-term heating, such as warming dinner rolls for a few seconds; baskets and bowls may be flammable.

Not Recommended

- Glass jars and bottles shatter and cause damage and injury. Regular glass is too thin to be used in a microwave. It can
- Paper bags microwave use These are a fire hazard, except for popcorn bags that are designed for
- Styrofoam plates and cups These can melt and leave an unhealthy residue on food
- Plastic storage and food containers Containers such as margarine tubs can melt in the microwave.
- Metal utensils These can damage your oven. Remove all metal before cooking

Note: Should you wish to check if a dish is safe for microwaving, place the empty dish in the oven and microwave on HIGH for 30 seconds. A dish that becomes very hot should not be used

SETTING THE CLOCK

- Touch CLOCK pad.
- Use the number pads to enter the correct time. You must touch at least three numbers to set the clock(one for hour and two for minutes).
- 3. Touch CLOCK pad again.

NOTE:

This is a 12 hour clock. When the oven is first plugged in or when power resumes after a power interruption, the display will show ENTER CLOCK TIME, if you prefer not to have the clock displayed, touch RESET pad. You can check the clock time while cooking is in progress by touching the CLOCK pad.

SETTING THE OVEN TIMER

- 1. Touch TIMER pad.
- 2. Enter the amount of time you want to

count down by touching the number pads. Digit time is in minutes and seconds and set left to right. Set one digit (a 5 for 5 seconds) or up to four digits (2405 for 24 minutes, 5 seconds).

SETTING COOKING TIMES AND POWER LEVELS

- A. One-stage Cooking
- 1. Use the number pads to set a cooking time. You can set a cooking time from one second to 99 minutes and 99 seconds. If you are setting a time greater than one minute, you must enter numbers for both minutes and seconds. For example, to set 20 minutes, enter

COOKING TECHNIQUES

Your microwave makes cooking easier than conventional cooking, provided you keep these considerations in mind:

tirring

Stir foods such as casseroles and vegetables while cooking to distribute heat evenly. Food at the outside of the dish absorbs more energy and heats more quickly, so stir from the outside to the center. The oven will turn off when you open the door to stir your food.

Arrangement

Arrange unevenly shaped foods, such as chicken pieces or chops, with the thicker, meatier parts toward the outside of the turntable where they receive more microwave energy. To prevent overcooking place delicate areas, such as asparagus tips, toward the center of the turntable.

Shielding

Shield food with narrow strips of aluminum foil to prevent overcooking. Areas that need shielding include poultry wing-tips, the ends of poultry legs, and corners of square baking dishes. Use only small amounts of aluminum foil. Larger amounts can damage your oven.

Turning

Turn foods over midway through cooking to expose all parts to microwave energy. This

is especially important with large foods such as roasts.

Standing

Foods cooked in the microwave build up internal heat and continue to cook for a few minutes after heating stops. Let foods stand to complete cooking, especially foods such as cakes and whole vegetables. Roasts need this time to complete cooking in the center without overcooking the outer areas. All liquids, such as soup or hot chocolate, should be shaken or stirred when cooking is complete. Let liquids stand a moment before serving. When heating baby food, stir well at removal and test the temperature before serving.

Adding moisture

Microwave energy is attracted to water molecules. Food that is uneven in moisture content should be covered or allowed to stand so that the heat disperses evenly. Add a small amount of water to dry food to help it cook.




